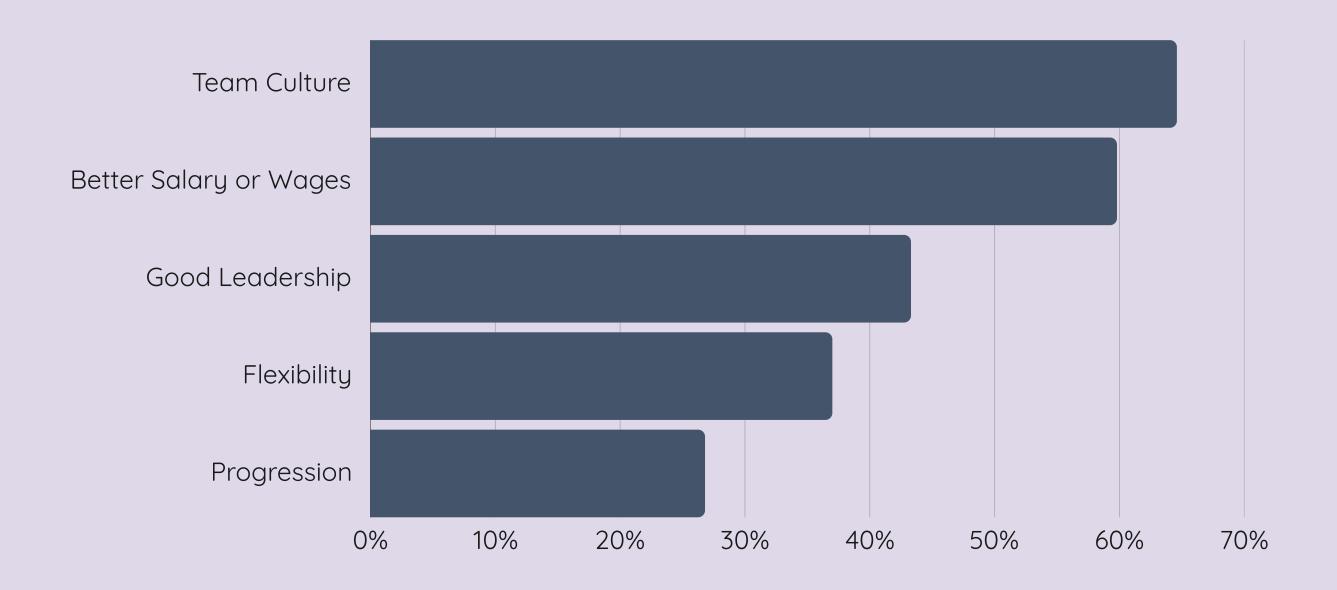

# How are we doing?

There is a concerning level of bullying and harassment reported by people working in the sector

Just a third of people feel they have learning and development opportunities to help them grow



People in the tourism sector generally feel positive about their job but just 15% say they **love it** 

70% of people know how their role contributes to the company's vision and values



47% are motivated and inspired by their work

55% see their manager/s as good role models

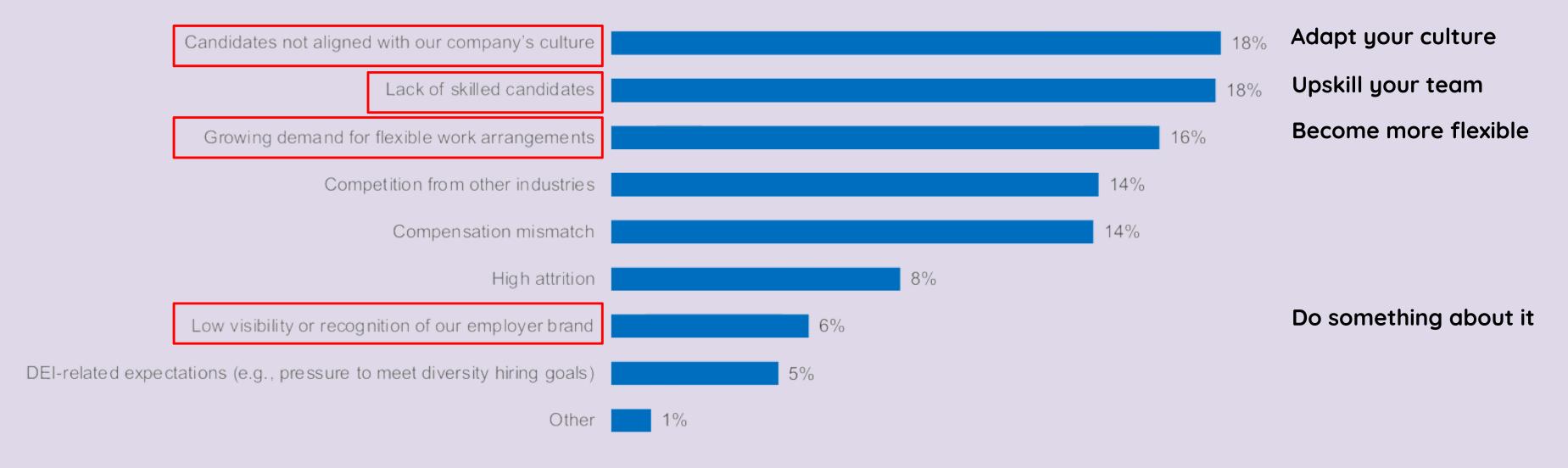

# Lessons from 2x Winning Employer of Choice

#### Make Listening a Habit, Not a Task

Build consistent feedback loops - like pulse surveys - and act on what you hear. Small, meaningful changes over time create a culture of trust and improvement.



#### Recognise and Amplify Success

Celebrate team wins regularly and use them to inspire others. Recognition not only drives morale but also attracts like-minded talent who share your values.

#### **Practice Transparency**

Open the door to honest conversations at every level. Whether it's "ask me anything" sessions or updates on company goals, transparency fosters connection and ownership across your team.



# Build your employer brand with your team

#### **Evaluate**

Understand your reputation and what you do well

Assess expectations

Identify gaps

#### Develop

Define what makes you unique

Create strategies to improve

Forecast future talent needs

Build communication processes

#### Launch

Launch a communication strategy

Promote your employer brand

Ask for feedback

Ensure consistency

#### Measure

Monitor and measure

(i.e.: retention, employee satisfaction, number of applications and social media engagement)

#### Iterate

Keep it up!

Take time to refine strategies with new feedback
